Description

Food safety experts from government, industry, and academia will gather in Madison, Wisconsin on May 18 and 19 for the annual Food Research Institute Spring Meeting at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The Institute has a long history of excellence in identifying and addressing food safety issues. This focus on food microbiology and toxicology has developed through academic pursuits and partnerships with industry and government.

In recognition of FRI's 70th anniversary, the formal program will highlight the Institute's contributions to food safety, including developments and research in staphylococcal poisoning, mycotoxin detection and control, antimicrobials, and *Clostridium botulinum*. The program will also look toward future research involving the microbiome of foods, microbial evolution, new detection methods, and packaging advances. Other topics to be featured include produce safety and water quality, validation and preventive control for low-moisture foods, *Listeria* in frozen food, and the legal implications of finding environmental positives. The meeting will feature scientists from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and other universities as well as industry and government.

Dr. Michael Doyle, Director of the Center for Food Safety at the University of Georgia, will present the William C. Frazier Memorial Award lecture and will be recognized for his contributions to food microbiology. Wednesday evening also will feature a poster session, reception, and opportunities to network with colleagues.
